


Reading

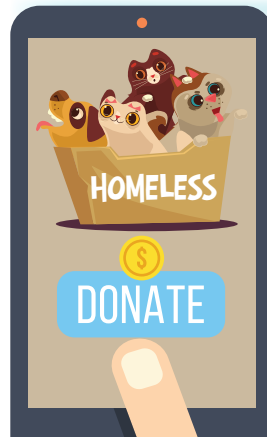
It is a good application to find your way.

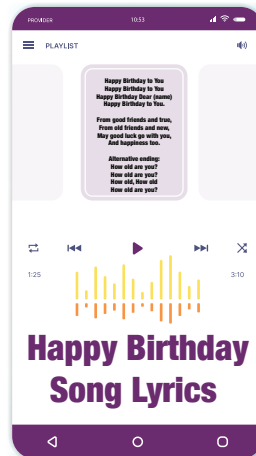
